

CEDARBURG AREA

Visitors consistently rank Cedarburg as their favorite small town getaway. The beautifully preserved downtown Historic District offers a delightful array of specialty stores, art exhibits, museums, restaurants and inns. From charming shops and cozy cafes, to meticulously maintained historic buildings and architecture, Cedarburg is a city you'll never tire of exploring ... and it's easy to get to, just 20 minutes north of Milwaukee. Our Visitor Center in the General Store Museum is open seven days a week during the summer (closed Sundays during the winter).

While visiting Cedarburg, tour, taste and enjoy award-winning wines at Cedar Creek Winery located in the historic Cedar Creek Settlement along the banks of Cedar Creek. The Settlement complex, established in a circa-1864 former woolen mill, houses more than 25 gift, clothing and antiques shops, art galleries and restaurants.

Throughout the year, visitors are encouraged to travel the Ozaukee Interurban Trail which passes through downtown Cedarburg. Cyclists and walkers can easily stop at the local eateries, coffee houses or microbrewery, all of which are located near the trail's route through the city. Another favorite stop is the Wisconsin Museum of Quilts & Fiber Arts (grand opening scheduled August 11, 2011).

Widely renowned for its family-oriented festivals which attract thousands of tourists each year, over

the past several decades Cedarburg has also earned a fine reputation as a well-respected arts enclave. Visit Plein Air in June and the fall Arts Weekend, during which local artists open their studios to the public. The 580-seat Cedarburg Performing Arts Center is known for attracting world-class performers to its stage, and the Cedarburg Cultural Center hosts an eclectic mix of ongoing art exhibits and acclaimed live musical performances. There's even a newly renovated movie theater, the historic Rivoli Theater.
