FESTIVALS

Arrrrgh ... what is **Port Pirate Fest**, you ask? It's Wisconsin's only pirate festival. June 7 through June 9 in Port Washing-

ton ... a weekend of mayhem and merriment, where there is something for everyone, young and old, and admission is free. Enjoy history and humor, music and munchies, drinks and dancing, shopping and sideshows and even sailing on the tall ship Denis Sullivan.

Cedarburg's Strawberry Festival, June 22 and June 23, offers an art-filled weekend brimming with this most luscious summer fruit. Enjoy live music, browse and purchase original crafts and artwork from hundreds of artists, sample food from dozens of vendors and enjoy some of the most decadent homegrown strawberries in the area. Don't miss Party in the Park, expanded festival offerings in Cedar Creek Park that include live music, a beer garden, family friendly activities and more.



Pirate Fest

The **Giro d' Grafton**, held Saturday, June 22, is one of the stops on the popular Tour of America's Dairyland race series. The exciting six-turn Giro d' Grafton course has plenty to offer all racers and spectators. The 0.85 mile criterium runs through downtown Grafton with the start/finish line at the intersection of Beech Street and Wisconsin Avenue amid a massive crowd of fans. Spectators can expect a full day of thrilling races, great food from downtown businesses. live music and big fun.

Suburban Motors Harley-Davidson's **Block Fest** is Saturday, July 13, at its location in Thiensville. Festival goers immerse themselves in HOG heaven with live

goers immerse themselves in HOG heaven with live music, food and drink, vendor booths and more – including, of course, plenty of Harleys and Harley merchandise.

Port Washington Fish Day, the "world's largest one-day outdoor fish fry" festival, takes place July 20. The festival kicks off at 8 a.m. with a run/walk, followed by a huge parade at 10 a.m. Festival offerings include an arts and crafts show, a carnival with games and rides, five stages of music and family entertainment, nine fish

and chips stands and a huge fireworks finale to end the day.

Gather up the family and head to the **Ozaukee County Fair** July 31 through Aug. 4 at the Ozaukee County Fairgrounds in Cedarburg. This is

one of the last free fairs in the Midwest, and offers five days of live music, a full midway, exhibitions, animal shows and judging, opening night fireworks and great fair food and fun. Paid grandstand events like demolition derbies, monster trucks and truck and tractor pulls help keep

admission free for everyone.
